

## The Utah State Fire Marshal's Office

Utah has a LP-Gas section. This section of the USFMO governs LP-Gas in the State of Utah. They work with the LP-Gas Board to enforce the Utah Fire Prevention Safety Act 53-7 Part 3 and Administrative Rules R710-6.

Here are some of the requirement of the LP-Gas industry.

- 1. All businesses working with LP-Gas and their systems are required to be licensed by the Utah State Fire Marshal's Office.
- 2. All Employees who work with LP-Gas and their systems must be certified by the State Fire Marshal's office.
- 3. Permitting is required for LP-Gas systems over 5,000 gallons, all liquid transfer systems, and retail cylinder exchange cages. Our office sends a copy of the plot plans and our approval letter to the local jurisdiction.
- 4. Any accident involving LP-Gas is required to be reported to the State Fire Marshal's Office.
- 5. Our office performs annual inspections on various LP-Gas systems.

Our office is here to help.

- 1. We have teamed up with the Rocky Mountain Propane Association to provide propane emergencies training with our propane prop to local fire departments.
